## INTRODUCTION

This issue of the Council Executive Report provides a summary of the Town's performance during June 2023. The information is organized in sections based on the Town's General Plan:

**LAND MANAGEMENT:** How Marana plans to use the land and where the Town expects growth.



#### SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL PERMITS ISSUED IN JUNE 2023




