RE: Withdraw of Application for Serial Number and Petitions Submitted


Dear Ms. McCleary and Ms. Fairall:

My office represents Arizonans for Responsible Development, Sponsored by Worker Power, Marana Political Action Committee No. COM2026-01. On January 8, 2026, the Town of Marana's Clerk's Office received three applications for serial number from the Committee submitted by Jordan Greenslade. By this writing, the Committee hereby rescinds and withdraws its application for serial number associated with Marana Ordinance No. 2026.002 (which was assigned REF2026-02) and that associated with Marana Ordinance No. 2026.003 (which as assigned REF2026-03).

Furthermore, the Committee retracts the petitions signatures it submitted in support of both of these measures and no longer supports placing these measures on the ballot. As you are aware, it is the committee that is the proponent of the petition that files the petitions, *see e.g.*, A.R.S. § 19-121(C) (“the committee that is the proponent of the petition and that files the petitions shall organize the signature sheets and group them by circulator and is solely responsible for compliance with this subsection”), the political committee bears the burden for failing to have properly circulated petition, *see, e.g.*, *Morales v. Archibald*, 246 Ariz. 398 (2019) (for failure to attach the title and text to petition sheets), and thus it is axiomatic that such committees may withdraw submitted petition sheets.
