Presumptive standards for remote and in-person hearings	)	No. 2022-001

The Court having reviewed Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order 2022-88 regarding presumptive standards for remote and in-person hearings,


IT IS ORDERED, adopting the presumptive standards with the following exceptions as indicated in Appendix 1 to this order:

1. Changes of plea and sentencing hearings will be presumptively in-person unless the case is eligible for a plea by mail or telephonic plea and the Defendant obtains the required paperwork from the prosecutor, completes said paperwork, and returns it to the court prior to the change of plea date, in which case the hearing may be remote.
2. Bond forfeiture hearings will be presumptively in-person.
3. Probation violation disposition hearings will be presumptively remote.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that any presumptively remote hearing may be held in-person if the Defendant wishes to appear in-person. The Defendant is not required to provide advance notice to the court of an in-person appearance.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, permitting a judge assigned to a case to make a hearing-specific deviation from the presumptive manner in which a hearing must be held if holding the hearing in the presumptive manner is not practical or otherwise not in the interest of justice. Notice shall be provided to the parties when such a deviation is made.
